Who Are We Really Feeding?

I am an advocate for children and youth and I'm fortunate to work for an organization that shares that commitment. At RAFP, we understand the profound impact food security has on the health and stability of every household, especially those with children.

Once a longtime supporter suggested that our children's nutrition programs prevent adults from taking responsibility for their families. I believe that when an adult takes the step to seek support in order to care for a child's well-being, they deserve to find a community that stands with them, not one that turns them away. Supporting families in times of need isn't about replacing responsibility; it's about reinforcing it with compassion, dignity, and trust.

I am excited to announce that RAFP is now an official Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) site for the Hodag Food Wagon! The SFSP is funded by the USDA through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, and helps ensure that children and teens have access to nutritious meals during the summer months. This is the *first and only* RAFP program that receives funding for food *and* for administrative and operational costs. This is a pretty big deal. This level of support makes a significant difference and provides sustainable funding for the Hodag Food Wagon. The Hodag Food Wagon will provide 12,000 meals to kids and teens in just 8 weeks this summer.

Our Hodag Kids Programs do so much more than give people free food. I have watched our organization and community transform through feeding our kids. We have redefined what it means to be food insecure. We refuse to aim only to reduce hunger; we want food security. Our community thrives when households are stable and bellies are full.

It is also about opportunity. Not the opportunity to "save the children," it is our opportunity as adults to set the example and share in the responsibility of making our community what we want it to be. Safe. Healthy. And full of opportunity.

Weekend Food For Kids 2024-25

Since 2011, RAFP has offered the Weekend Food For Kids (WFFK) Program in partnership with the School District of Rhinelander. The program gives students the option to receive a free weekend meal bag that includes one breakfast, one lunch, and a few kid-friendly snacks. In the 2024-25 school year, WFFK provided approximately 21,250 meals to children and teens in our community.

The Hodag Food Wagon: Summer Pop-Ups at the Pantry 2025

This summer marks the exciting launch of the Hodag Food Wagon at the Rhinelander Area Food Pantry (RAFP)! We've transitioned from our previous location at the Rhinelander District Library to RAFP, giving us more space, more resources, and more fun. We're also excited to be a Meals-To-Go site as part of the USDA's Summer Food Service Program. So, what does that mean for kids and teens?

It means that Hodag Food Wagon meal bags are better than ever and packed with food that kids (and their adults!) actually want to eat. Each bag includes 5 breakfasts and 5 lunches, all meeting the USDA's Child Nutrition Guidelines. Think that sounds boring? Don't worry! The Hodag knows what healthy food kids love!

More space also means more summer fun! Each week, Hodag Bites will feature tasty snack demos and games hosted by our favorite FoodWlse Nutrition Educators so there's always something delicious and engaging happening. Our beautiful outdoor area now includes tasting garden boxes brimming with fresh veggies and herbs for kids to explore.

To keep minds as active as bodies, the Food For The Mind table offers free books for all reading levels, supporting literacy all summer long. Plus, look out for special pop-up events from community partners like WIC, the Oneida County Health Department, Bowen's Bus Service, and more!

The Hodag Food Wagon is open to all children and teens under 18—no registration or income requirements. It's our way of helping kids stay nourished, engaged, and ready to grow, while also giving parents a little extra help keeping the fridge full. We post regular updates on our Facebook

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: THE COMMODITIES SUPPLEMENTAL FOOD PROGRAM "SENIOR STOCKBOXES"





Supporting Seniors with Nutritious Food: The Vital Role of CSFP at RAFP

RAFP is proud to serve as a distribution site for the USDA's Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), commonly known as the Senior Stockbox Program. This essential federal initiative provides monthly boxes of nutritious food to eligible seniors aged 60 and older who earn \$1,580 or less per month.

Each Stockbox, valued at approximately \$70, includes pantry staples such as shelf-stable milk, canned meats, and low-sodium vegetables, along with a rotating featured item like frozen pork chops. These boxes help ensure that seniors in our community, who make up 33% of our pantry customers, have reliable access to healthy, high-quality food.

RAFP currently distributes between 250 and 300 boxes each month, depending on availability. Unfortunately, demand continues to exceed supply: our waiting list can grow to over 85 seniors who qualify but are not receiving boxes.

The CSFP is one of several USDA food assistance programs funded by the federal government. For rural food pantries like ours, it plays a critical role. Traditional food donation channels no longer provide many staple items at no cost, and essentials like canned meat and shelf-stable milk are now among the most expensive products for RAFP to procure.

While recent passage of the federal budget bill did not reduce CSFP funding, final funding decisions are still in progress through the annual appropriations process. Both the House and Senate Agriculture Subcommittees have, so far, proposed maintaining current funding levels for CSFP, a positive sign.

Looking ahead, it's important to understand that CSFP, along with programs like SNAP, school meals, and TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program), is governed by the Farm Bill, a comprehensive piece of legislation that shapes U.S. agricultural and nutrition policy. The current Farm Bill is set to expire on September 30, 2025, and reauthorization efforts will be vital to the future of these programs.

As we continue supporting seniors in our community, we also recognize the importance of maintaining strong federal support for food assistance programs. With continued community involvement, we can help ensure that local seniors have access to the nutritious food they need.

RAFP IS READY FOR SUMMER PROGRAMS & SERVICES!

Thanks to the support of two generous grants and incredible community partnerships, RAFP is proud to announce the completion of the Front Porch Project! This transformative expansion is already enriching our summer services. First proposed to the Rhinelander Community Foundation, this project became a key component in making space for The Hodag Food Wagon to operate on site.

The Rhinelander Community Foundation joined our vision by awarding the Hodag Food Wagon Expansion & Front Porch Project a \$5,000 grant. These funds supported the purchase of a seasonal pergola for afternoon shade, outreach banners and signage, t-shirts and aprons for our hardworking volunteers, safety equipment and signs for our parking lot, and a beautiful variety of plants to bring our garden beds to life.





A big thank you also goes to The Home Depot for awarding a generous grant of nearly \$7,000 and contributing 18 hours of hands-on volunteer service!
